Fall Meeting At Chicagopex Fast Approaching

Special Society Dinner Planned, Reservations Required Soon

October 10, 2005...The Fall Happening of the U.S. Philatelic Classics Society will be held this year in conjunction with the Chicagopex show in Chicago on November 18-20, 2005. Society members will gather to exchange friendship, camaraderie, stamps, and stories. Chicagopex is the largest meeting of the year in Chicago, a city famous for good philatelic shows and serious collectors.

The big event for Classics Society members will be the Society Dinner and Meeting which will be held at the David Adler mansion in nearby Lake Forrest, IL. Built in the 1920s for Albert Lasker, the father of modern advertising, the 490 acre estate included 27 buildings and an 18 hole golf course which was said to be the third best in the U.S. during its day.

The main house [picture] is owned today by society member James Milgram, who is preparing to host the dinner. Lake Forest is well-known for its wonderful houses built by the wealthy merchants of Chicago as summer homes, and this 25,000 sq. ft. building is one of the most famous architecturally.



Seating is limited to 50 persons so get your reservation in right away. The cost will be \$45, which includes two way coach transportation from the convention hotel at 6:30 PM on Friday November 18, the first day of the three day meeting. The bus will depart for the hotel at 11 P.M (approx. 30 minute ride). This promises to be a fun experience with Dr. Milgram giving a talk on the Civil War after some great food and drink.
