
- Establish the itinerary of the cover


London debited Belgium 1/4d (8d incoming ship fee plas
8d br. transit under 1844 U.K. - BELGIUM convention).

Rosend accounting box showed U.K. debit on top line 1/4",
16 decenies on second line (conversion to Belg. currency), and
b decenies Belgium internel fix for 10 gm letter. Total
postage due was sum of lines 2 and 3 or 22 decenies

- •5¢ paid for U.S. inland fee to Boston (9X1 adhesive)
- •London marked COLONIES/&c ART.13 (3s4d per ounce debit to France)
- •Paris marked 21 decimes postage due (10 decimes to U.K. plus 11 decimes internal fee)

- 5¢ British open mail rate paid, but mail to Sumatra had to be fully prepaid 33¢ (Southampton route) or 39¢/45¢ (Marseille route)
- Boston clerk probably took rate for Penang instead of Pedang from rate table























Cunard steamship *Scotia* carrying the mails in the 1860s (Currier & Ives)
