


Mail to Turkey

Via Syria



30¢ single rate by French mail to Aintab, Turkey via Aleppo, Syria. British Pkt. from Boston, Ma. Dec. 29, 1863 to England. Foreign Exchange transit mark dated 10 Jany. '64.



30¢ single rate. Black segmented cork cancel and red "Boston Br. Pkt. Nov. 25 (1867) 'PAID 27'," credit date stamp. Per Steamer "Asia". Backstamps of Marseilles, France and Alexandria, Egypt.

Mail to Uruguay



90¢, vertical strip of three, paying the double rate, British mail via England, from Philadelphia, Pa., May 30, (1865), red London 'Paid' and Calais transit date stamps, red '48' handstamp credit mark, and a black oval Montivideo receiving date stamp.

Mail to Canada

90¢ Usage



\$1.10, paying the 11x10¢ rate from Boston, Mass. Sept. 21 (1867), to Montreal, Canada. Backstamped "Montreal and dated Sept. 23". This is the second of two known uses to Canada of the 90¢ denomination, yet it is unrecorded in the census in the Chronicle.

\$1.08(51¢/57¢) rate, New York, March 19, 1862 to Shanghai, China by British Mail via Marseilles, prepaid by '66' credit marking and '2d' credit, London 'Paid' Ap4 '62 transit mark, backstamped Hong Kong, May 12, '62.

Mail to China



\$1.14 (51¢ per  $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. - 57¢ per  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. - \$1.08 over  $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.,  
not over  $\frac{3}{4}$ oz. - over  $\frac{3}{4}$  but not over an ounce  
\$1.14) rate New York Sep. 9, 1862 by British Pkt.  
"Persia" via Marseilles to Shanghai, China. U.S.  
share of this rate was 2x5¢, hence the credit to  
Great Britain was the balance or \$1.04, thus the  
magenta ink '104' marking. Hong Kong No. 12 '62  
backstamp.

Mail to England



\$1.44 (6x24¢) rate, from New York on "Am. Pkt. July 3" (1865) 'Paid', by British mail on the "City of Manchester", red '18' credit mark, and "Paid, Liverpool, U.S. Packet, July 12, '65" datestamp, and London, July 13, 1865 receiving backstamp.

Of the nine 90¢ covers recorded used to England, this is the only cover with additional 24¢ and 30¢ stamps.

Mail to England



\$1.44 (24¢x6) rate, San Francisco, Cal.  
Jul. 3, 1865 to Exeter, England. "Sacramento  
to Panama thence via New York" routing.

One of three covers franked with 90¢ from  
California: Transcontinental to Europe.

Mail to France

30¢ pair

90¢ block of four



\$4.20, (28x15¢) rate, New York Oct. 6 (1866)  
to Lyon, France by French packet sailing  
Oct. 8. Lyon 2? Oct. '66 backstamp. Sealing  
wax use on back helps explain the very  
high rate to the director of the bank of  
Lyon. The only recorded block of the 90¢  
on cover.

Mail to France



\$1.05 (7x15¢) rate, New Orleans, La., Dec.14(1864),  
through New York, Dec.24, 'Paid' datestamp, to  
Bordeaux, France,"by the first steamer" leaving  
New York. In this case an American Packet by  
French mail through Calais, France, Jan.8, 1865.

Mail to France



\$1.95 rate(13x15¢), New York, Dec.26,1862 to Bordeaux, France. Red New York 'Paid' Dec.27 datestamp, Magenta '78' credit marking(credit to France), and backstamps for Paris arrival Jan.10,'63 and Bordeaux Jan.11,'63 datestamps. An extremely high rate to France.

Mail to Japan



\$1.06, 2x53¢ rate by British mail via Marseilles, Elmira, N.Y. Oct.28(1866) to Kanagawa, Japan. Red N.York Br. Pkt. Paid backstamp and London transit mark over the 5¢ stamp. Red pencil '2'(double rate) and '96' credit.

The only recorded 90¢ usage on cover to Japan.

Mail to New South Wales



\$1.32 (4x33¢) rate, Washington, D.C., Oct. 2 (1866)  
datestamp, red N.Y. Br. Pkt. 'Paid' and London  
'Paid' datestamps, to Sydney, New South Wales.  
Dec. 19, 1866 Sydney receiving backstamp.

5 90¢ covers are known to New South Wales.

This is the only cover recorded showing additional  
franking of other (12¢+30¢) stamps.

Mail to New South Wales



90¢, (2x45¢) rate, Washington, D.C. Jan. 9 circular date stamp to Sydney, New South Wales. Red "N. York Br. Pkt. Paid" datestamp, London transit, endorsed "per Steamer via London and Marseilles", red manuscript "80" credit, "Ship Letter Sydney MR 20, 1866" backstamp.

Five 90¢ covers are recorded to this destination. Three of them are single frankings.

All 90¢ 1861 covers to New South Wales are from the Hogan correspondence.

Mail to Norway



92¢, paying the double 46¢ Prussian closed mail rate. San Francisco, April 18, 1862 datestamp and matching cogwheel cancels. Red "N. York American Packet" postmark, magenta manuscript "46" credit, Aachen and Hamburg transit postmarks.


The only recorded 90¢ cover to Norway from the 1861 Issue

Mail to Zanzibar



45¢ rate, Salem, Ma. by British mail via Mar-  
seilles to Zanzibar, East Africa.  
Lower cover has boxed 'Short Paid' crossed out,  
stamps cancelled with fancy Salem, Ma. black  
cork wedges.

Mixed Franking



45¢ rate, British mail via Marseilles, cancelled by black Salem, Mass. Aug.9 "Witch's Pendant" datestamp, on blue 1867 cover to Zanzibar via Aden. Red Boston '24' credit datestamp, red London transit circular datestamp, crayon '1' and '10' rates, forwarded from Steamer Point-Aden with India 8 annas Victoria postage, cancelled by "124" numeral in diamond grid (Steamer Point canceller), backstamped at Steamer Point on arrival (Sep.16) and departure for Zanzibar (Sep.22).

This mixed franking cover from the Goodhue correspondence is the second recorded example of the use of forwarding from Aden through the post office, thus requiring the India 8 annas postage.
