
III.B. 1847 U.S.-Bremen Convention - 1851 Rates

Effective 15 August 1853, rates were simplified and reduced to 15¢ for German states that reduced their postage to the equivalent of 5¢ or less. This 15¢ total rate represented the sum of a 10¢ international rate (5¢ U.S. internal, 4¢ sea postage, and 1¢ Bremen postage) plus 5¢ German internal under the G.A.P.U.







Written by the New York clerk to indicate 4 times the 15¢ rate.

Quadruple 15¢ rate overpaid from Bangor, Maine, 1 October 1856 to Berlin, Prussia, by *Washington* (Ocean Line), New York 4 October 1856, Bremen 20 October 1856.

Progression under the convention was one rate, two rates, four rates, and two more rates for each additional ounce (triple rate was not added until 1860). Bangor weighed the letter at *over* 2 ounces (6 rates or **90**¢). New York clerk weighed letter at *under* 2 ounces and wrote magenta **4/15** ct to indicate four times the 15¢ rate. Hanover treated letter as a triple rate, crossed out **4/15** fraction and wrote **f** 6 to indicate a 6 sgr credit to Prussia, 3 times the 2 sgr single rate credit.
