"WE HAVE A MOST AWFUL FLOOD IN THE LEHIGH & DELAWARE SUCH AS HAS NOT BEEN SEEN BY THE OLDEST INHABITANTS. OUR LEHIGH BRIDGE IS GONE AND EVERY BRIDGE UP TO BIERGI — THE EMBANKMENT BELOW THE DAM IS DESTROYED — THE TOLL HOUSE COLLECTION OFFICE IS DEMOLISHED — ALL THE FRAME BUILDINGS IN PORTER'S FLATS, EXCEPT THE LARGE HOUSE AT THE OUTLET LOCK, ARE SWEPT OFF — A GREAT MANY HOUSES & OTHER BUILDINGS FROM UP THE COUNTRY PASSED DOWN THE FLOOD IN THE COURSE OF THE NIGHT — JACOB WAGENER'S STOREHOUSE, C[HARLES] MICHELER'S WHARF IS ALSO GONE, MICHELER'S AND SLETOR'S WOOD, FROM 3 TO 400 CORDS, ALL LOST — THE LUMBER AT THE SOUTH EASTON SAWNILLS GONE—THE DELAWARE BRIDGE CONSIDERABLY SHATTERED AND NOT YET OUT OF DANGER.
