





New Orleans Jan 20, 1857 via New York, rated as US inland prepaid via Brit PKT.
London (Feb 16 57), Calais & Italy Feb 19, 1857. 7 dec due (14¢) at Turin.
Tray marking, applied at London, shows Am PKT service which, if not in error, further indicates that the 5¢ prepayment was accepted at N. Y. exchange office.
(Both an Am PKT and a Brit PKT arrived at Liverpool on same day.)
An interim or 'three month's' period cover to Italy.

ONE CENT STAMP 1851 TO 1861

Plate Three was put in service about Spring, 1856. Inexplicably, it was retired after only a year.

Prepayment in stamps on domestic mail had been required from Jan 1.





Plate Four

Plate No. 4 was readied in February, 1857. A six relief transfer roll was used. Each relief was trimmed to make room for perforations. This produced four types plus a sub-type (IC). The plate was retired in 8 months. Imperforates were produced during the first three months.







Perforating was begun in July, 1857. Sheets from Plate One Late had been stacked under those from newer plates. These 'older' sheets were then perforated in turn.











Plate Two

When the perforating of 1¢ stamps began July, 1857, only Plates 2 & 4 were in use. These plates, with remnants of Plate One Late, supplied the 1¢ stamps until late that year. Plate 2 was continued in service until late fall, despite its flaw.


